

HOUSE RULES FOR MUSEUM VISITORS/VISITORS TOWN HALL

Introduction

A number of house rules have been agreed from the point of view of preserving and managing the collection and maintaining the building. These house rules are mentioned below.

If we notice that a visitor is not adhering to these rules, the visitor will be addressed.

Touching museum objects

It is not permitted to touch the museum objects, unless mentioned otherwise on a sign. These are, for example, the activities in the Battles Before and After 1572- room.

Food and drinks

It is not permitted to eat or drink in the museum; this also applies to the town hall.

Smoking

Smoking is not permitted in the museum. This also applies to the town hall.

Dogs

Assistance dogs are welcome in the museum and in the town hall, other dogs are not

Wet coats

Must be taken off and left in the wardrobe.

Umbrellas

These are not allowed into the museum, but must be left in the cloakroom.

Bags and backpacks

Bags are not allowed to be taken with you, but must be stored in a locker.

A coin for lockers can be lent.

(Small handbags are allowed into the museum).

Photographing

Photography is allowed in the museum. Without flash and for personal use only.

If the press wants to take photos, an appointment must be made with Marijke Holtrop.

Bridal reports

This is only possible by appointment with one of the museum employees via info@historischmuseumdenbriel.nl

Use toilet

Only museum visitors can use the museum toilet on the ground floor. This is not allowed for other people (the toilet cannot handle heavy use).
